Homework

You are expected to read for 15-20 minutes per day. This is the year the you start to build up reading stamina. You will get weekly spellings to learn. Each week you will get one piece of homework, either Maths or English.

It will be handed out on a Friday and expected back in on Wednesday.

Entering and Leaving school

Class 2 share their door with Class 1, so you will be coming in the same way that you are used to! You will have your own peg with your name on to hang your things up.

At the end of the day, you go out of the same door that you came in through. We will dismiss you when we see that your parent/guardian is waiting for you. If you have a younger sibling in Reception class 1, you will need to go to the hall to leave by the hall door.

Rewards and sanctions—Dojos

Year 1 have dojos. There are more ways to earn dojos in year 1. You get to choose a piece of treasure for every 50 points that you earn!

In Year 1 you can also lose dojos if you make poor choices.

We will agree a class charter on transition day. That is a set of guidelines that we agree on for the classroom. They're created to help children understand that they have certain rights and responsibilities in the classroom. These rights and responsibilities are important, as they help to keep them safe and happy while they receive their education.



Afternoons

You will be introduced to subject based learning through topic lessons. These include Geography, History, Art, Science and Design and Technology. They will also do computing lessons, Re, Music and Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education. Lots of new and exciting learning!
